

How to Access Ancestry at the Cranberry Township Public Library

A few notes before you start:

- To access Ancestry Library edition, you must be physically located at the library. You must be using a library computer or connected to Ancestry WiFi on your own computer or tablet.
- Check out a library laptop at the desk; you will need a library card, but can get one for free if you don't have one. You can also use a public computer, located near the Forge MakerSpace room.

Using the Library's computers;

1. The library computer will automatically connect to the correct WiFi.
2. Open any browser (Google, Microsoft Edge) and the library home page will automatically load.
3. Click on the Library Services menu, then click the link for Genealogy Resources and open that page
4. On the Genealogy Resources page, scroll down a bit until you see the Ancestry logo – it looks like this:

Using your own technology:

1. Take your own laptop or tablet to the library.
2. Connect to the library's Ancestry Wifi (the first time you connect, you'll need a password)
 - a. On an Apple device:
 - i. Open Settings
 - ii. Select WiFi
 - iii. Choose Ancestry from the list, and wait for it to connect.
 - b. On a Windows device:
 - i. Locate the internet access icon on the bottom menu near the right side. It's usually next to the volume control.
 - ii. Select Ancestry from the list
 - iii. Click Connect and wait for it to connect.
3. Now open a browser (Google, Edge, etc.) and go to the Genealogy Resources page using this link:
